## **SCHOLARSHIPS for CHINESE LAW GRADUATES TO STUDY ARBITRATION LAW IN STOCKHOLM**

The Master of International Commercial Arbitration Law program (ICAL) at Stockholm University is pleased to announce that two full-tuition scholarships have been generously donated by two leading Swedish law firms: Mannheimer Swartling and Vinge.

The scholarships will enable two highly-qualified Chinese students to participate in the one-year, post-graduate program in Stockholm, Sweden at Stockholm University. The Master of International Commercial Arbitration Law program provides a truly international and comparative study of arbitration law from both theoretical and practical perspectives. The ICAL program brings together about thirty exceptional young lawyers from all regions of the world each year to engage in an interactive program taught by academics and leading practitioners.

The program also gives students the unique opportunity to learn beyond the classroom by engaging in the Stockholm international arbitration community. Stockholm is globally recognized as one of the world's leading venues for arbitration and the home of the Arbitration Institute of the Stockholm Chamber of Commerce.





The Arbitration Institute of the Stockholm Chamber of Commerce (SCC) was established in 1917 and is one of the major international arbitral institutions in the world. The SCC has long been recognized as a neutral venue for the resolution of East-West disputes and today attracts parties and arbitrators from countries all over the world to resolve a broad range of disputes.
