General information regarding the scholarship application

We aim to make the process of applying for a scholarship as simple as possible. When applying for a scholarship, it is important to remember that scholarships are awarded to the most exceptional applicants based on merits.

How to apply

Complete the [online application form](#). There is no need to provide any supporting documents with the application form, as we will get them directly from our Admissions Department.

Please note that scholarship applicants must also separately apply to the Master programme in International Commercial Arbitration Law through the University Admissions website, www.universityadmissions.se. Applications may be submitted from 16 October 2018 to 15 January 2019.

Application process

Applications will be reviewed upon receipt, and shortlisted candidates will be considered throughout Spring 2019. Successful scholarship applicants will be contacted in Spring 2019.

Unfortunately, we are unable to notify all applicants of the result of their application or to provide feedback on individual applications due to the volume of applications and interest that we receive. If you do not hear from us by the end of April 2019, please assume that your scholarship application has been unsuccessful.

The scholarships covers the tuition fee only (no living costs, travel expenses, etc.) for the academic year 2019-2020, and cannot be deferred to a later academic year.

Eligible students

Chinese citizens with a Bachelor of Laws degree from a university in China.
